



CLGA Membership Information

Established in 1929, the Calgary Ladies Golf Association (CLGA) is a not-for-profit organization representing approximately 5000 women and junior girl golfers from 32 member- clubs in Calgary and surrounding area.

Eligibility for Membership

- ❖ Membership in the Calgary Ladies Golf Association (CLGA) is exclusively available to organized golf clubs located within an 80-kilometre radius of Calgary City Centre.
- ❖ To qualify, member clubs must maintain good standing with the Alberta Golf Association. Each year, the CLGA receives a report from Alberta Golf detailing the number of registered lady members at each club, including those with annual memberships. Our annual fee is based on this report.

Fee Structure

- \$3.00 per lady member, excluding juniors under 18 years of age. The minimum charge per club is \$25.00 with a maximum cap of \$1000.
- an additional fee of \$85.00 is required for the Tournament of Champions, held in September and open to all Club Champions.
- An Assessment Notice is sent annually by March 31, with payment due by May 31 of the same year. Once payment is received, all fully paid, active lady members of a club, possessing a valid Golf Canada handicap factor, become eligible to participate in all CLGA-sanctioned events for that year. Sponsored juniors may also be eligible to play.

Member Club Responsibilities, Hosting and Participation Guidelines

- ❖ Each member club is responsible for annually reviewing and updating its contact information on the CLGA website, typically through its designated club representative.
- ❖ Member clubs host 1 major event every 10 years in a rotation, which currently are:
 - Major-Calgary Ladies Amateur – closed, 3 days, max 96 players
 - Major-Calgary City Seniors Amateur – closed, 2 days, max 96 players
 - Calgary City Girls Junior – open, 2-days
- ❖ All member clubs are required to host other events as their turn comes up in rotation or which are yearly events currently as indicated below:
 - Harriet Watson Tournament of Champions – 1 day in September
 - City Medalist Series - 5 tee times once every 3-5 years
 - Rileys Best Ball Ladies Classic - Match play 2-lady team *(home & away games only if you have a team in Rileys)*
 - C.H.A.M.P.S. (Calgary Hospitality and Match Play Section), 5-7 home games per summer *(only if you are a member of C.H.A.M.P.S.)*
 - C.H.A.M.P.S. Wind-Up – 1 day in September *(only if you are a member of C.H.A.M.P.S.)*

- ❖ New member clubs will not be required to host a major event during the first two to three years of membership unless they wish to do so and it fits their schedule. However, clubs may be asked to host Rileys match play if any of their ladies are participating in the best ball event, Medalist, or possibly the Tournament of Champions (seven to eight tee times in September) as rotation dictates. If interested and space allows, clubs may also participate in the annual C.H.A.M.P.S. reciprocal hospitality league.
- ❖ Starting in 2025, as per a Special Resolution passed by member clubs and their representatives, the Vice President position on the CLGA Board will be filled by a member of the host club of the Calgary City Amateur.
- ❖ The CLGA conducts both Spring and Fall Annual General Meetings (AGMs) each year, where club representatives are invited and encouraged to attend. Each member club must designate two voting representatives from its ladies' league. Each representative is entitled to one vote at any meeting of member clubs, with proxy voting permitted as outlined in the Special Notice Vote of January 2024, approved unanimously by all member clubs. **To constitute a quorum at meetings, two-thirds of member clubs in good standing must be represented, either in person or by proxy.** For further details, please refer to the Association's Bylaws.

Membership Confirmation

To formalize membership in the CLGA, clubs must acknowledge and agree to the requirements outlined above, confirm that they have read and understand the Association's Bylaws, and agree to comply accordingly. The club's signing authority must endorse these commitments.
